- (5) a conference banquet followed by musical entertainment, a 50-50 raffle and an array of prizes in a “Chinese” raffle (Good luck!).

**Friday Evening Council and Town Hall Meeting.** D/6 is honored to welcome USPS National Executive Officer **V/C Mary Paige**

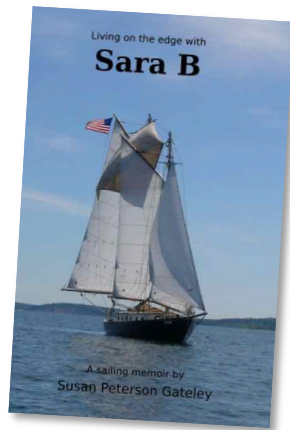

Following a brief Council meeting, our Town Hall Meeting will focus on membership recruitment and retention and squadron development, two areas of expertise of our National Chief's representative, who heads national committees on these topics. To facilitate discussion, please submit your questions for Mary Paige to me prior to the meeting at [freedmaj@upstate.edu](mailto:freedmaj@upstate.edu). Our town hall meeting will enable us to learn firsthand about USPS's national programs and efforts to help us strengthen and grow our D/6 squadrons in support of our threefold mission of boating education, public service, and the promotion of boating camaraderie.

**Keynote Speaker.** Our keynote speaker, **Susan Korzeniewski** is one of the top sailors in Oneida Lake's renowned Hobie 16 Fleet 204 and holds seven Women's North American Hobie 16 Championship titles, two with her daughter Erika. She is an accomplished Lake Ontario EYC racer in her Canadian-built monohull CS 36 *Ambassador* and has impressive off-shore racing and cruising credentials, including a trans-Atlantic passage. Her after-lunch talk on Saturday is entitled “*Racing and Cruising from Oneida Lake to Lake Ontario and the High Seas*”. See the separate article describing her accomplishments later in this issue. Please invite boating friends from Rochester area yacht clubs, ranging from the Rochester and Genesee Yacht Clubs to Sodus Bay, Fairhaven and beyond, including youth sailors, to this exciting keynote talk, to be followed by discussion and questions. The registration fee for non-USPS members for the Saturday afternoon keynote talk and workshop is \$5.

**Saturday Afternoon Workshop.** A workshop on “Changes and Challenges in Recreational Boating” will address timely issues in the recreational boating industry. **Kim Vorchheiner**, owner and manager of Ess-Kay Yards, Inc. in Brewerton manages a family-owned marina distinguished by a wonderful ship's store and



gift shop. Ess-Kay has met the needs of central New York boaters and “Great Loopers” for 45 years since 1972. Kim also is legislative liaison for Boating Industries Associates (BIA) of Central New York, our regional marine trade association. **Marianne Warfle**, manager of the new Port of Rochester Marina located near the mouth of the Genesee River, will speak from the perspective of manager of a municipally-owned marina backed by F|3, a national marina management company. **Susan Peterson Gately** of Silver Waters Sailing teaches sailing in Fairhaven, with a special interest in teaching women to sail, is involved with ownership and management of the Schooner *Sara B* at the Pleasant Beach Restaurant in Fairhaven and is a prolific author of over ten fascinating nautical books and pamphlets related to Lake Ontario sailing and its beaches, birds, history, sea stories, shipwrecks, myths and ecology. Discussion and questions will follow the work-



shop, along with a book signing of *Saving the Beautiful Lake: A quest for hope*, by Susan Peterson Gately.

The conference will include our usual brief **Friday evening Council and Saturday morning D/6 business meeting**, with the Chief Commander’s message presented by V/C Mary Paige Abbott, SN-IN. Education and other reports and awards will recognize the achievements and activities of our members and squadrons. **Sunday morning meetings** are designed to advance our USPS mission (see Conference Agenda).

All D/6 squadron commanders, squadron bridge officers, members and their guests are invited to our 2018 Spring Conference with a theme of “Women in Boating”, with the special opportunity to interact with our National Executive Officer V/C Mary Paige Abbott, SN-IN.

## North American Hobie 16 Champion Sailor Susan Korzeniewski to be Keynote Speaker at D/6 Spring Conference.



Susan Korzeniewski took a sailing course on the Black River in Boston while in college. That experience started her journey of racing catamarans and the desire to sail offshore. Born and raised in Syracuse, she is

one of the top sailors in Oneida Lake's renowned Hobie 16 Fleet 204. In addition to her Hobie 16 catamaran, she successfully races her Canadian-built monohull CS 36, *Ambassador*, in Lake Ontario EYC racing competitions, and participates in regional, national and international offshore racing rallies and regattas.

Learning to sail on fresh water did not discourage her from wanting the Blue Water experience. In 1991, Susan sailed her first Caribbean 1500 Rally from Norfolk, VA to St. Thomas. This experience fueled her goal to cross the Atlantic Ocean. From 1986 to 2018, Susan has competed in 13 Hobie World championships, 24 Hobie North American Champi-

onships and holds 7 Women's Hobie 16 North American Championship titles, two with her daughter, Erika.

In 1994, Susan's 10-year goal of crossing the Atlantic Ocean became a reality. She completed one of the highlights of her sailing life – a double-handed delivery from Baltimore, MD to Plymouth, England. Looking for another challenge in 2000, Susan was the first and only woman to Skipper the Worrell 1000, a 1000-mile race on a 20' Open catamaran.

Susan's passion for sports is recognized through her promotion of Women and Youths in sailing. She has conducted many race training seminars throughout the country. Susan currently holds a U.S. Coast Guard Captains License. Her talk is entitled *"Racing and Cruising from Oneida Lake to Lake Ontario and the High Seas"*.

**Method of calculation according to By Laws****ARTICLE 3 - The Council**

Section 3.1 The Council shall be composed of the elected bridge officers, the immediate past district commander or the most recent past commander willing to serve, the chairmen of the general committees, and the squadron commanders, which persons shall be the voting members of the Council.

**ARTICLE 4 - The Conference**

**Section 4.1** The Conference shall be composed of the Council, the past district commanders of this district who remain active members of district squadrons, and the delegates, which persons shall be the voting members of the Conference.

**Section 4.2.1** Delegates shall be selected by each squadron on the basis of one delegate for each 25 active members in good standing, or major fraction thereof, as of the preceding 1 March, with a minimum of two delegates per squadron.
